The CP core components- Students develop personal qualities and professional skills, as well as intellectual habits required for lifelong learning. The CP core components give context to the DP courses and the career-related study and draw all aspects of the framework together.

The personal and professional skills course aims to develop responsibility, practical problem-solving, good intellectual habits, ethical understanding, perseverance, resilience, an appreciation of identity and perspective and an understanding of the complexity of the modern world. Emphasis is placed on the development of skills needed to successfully navigate higher education, the workplace and society.

Service learning is the practical application of knowledge and skills toward meeting an identified community need. Through service, students develop and apply personal and social skills in real-life situations involving decision-making, problem-solving, initiative, responsibility and accountability for their actions.



EXTRA - CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

To create awareness about International cultural diversity and National ethos, all the important international festivals and special days are celebrated in the school with much enthusiasm and gusto.

Hobby Clubs

A wide range of 'Hobby Clubs' have been incorporated in the schedule where each student selects an activity of his/her choice and pursues it as a hobby. This facilitates the development of their inherent talents. The clubs include, Robotics, Pottery, Music, Reading, Karate, Taekwondo, Gymnastics, Astronomy, Aeromodeling, Cookery, Abacus to name a few.

House System

Students are grouped into four houses viz. Atlantis, Challenger, Columbia & Discovery in order to encourage greater participation in sports, cultural and literary activities. Belonging to a particular 'house' generates camaraderie, motivation, enthusiasm and enhances a healthy spirit of competition among students. The allocation of House begins in Class I and House uniform forms a compulsory part of the attire on specific days, adding a surge of colour on the campus.

Thematic Assemblies

We take note of national and international festivals as well as anniversaries and celebrate them through dance, drama, music, debate, story-telling sessions, painting and other creative endeavours in the form of 'Thematic Assemblies'.

Student Enrichment Programmes - Field Trips and Excursions

Field Trips and excursions are extensions of concepts explored in the classroom as facts reveal themselves in the form of experiences and are etched in our minds permanently. In pursuance of the methodology of 'learning by doing', the children are exposed to camping and coping with life skills, thus making them self-reliant and adventurous.

Sharing and Caring

With a view to inculcate a habit of "sharing and caring" the school undertakes various social work projects. In order to sensitise our children and give them a first-hand exposure to the realities that they will encounter in society, visits to orphanages, old age homes, SOS Villages etc. are encouraged. They also volunteer to help organizations like the Blind Association, Helpage India, Cancer Foundation, Samarthanam Trust for the Disabled and Smile Foundation.

External Examinations

To give our students a head start and equip them to make a mark on the national and international educational arena, the school provides them with ample opportunities to appear for external examinations conducted by organizations of repute. Not only have many of our students excelled in these examinations but have also moved further and represented the institution at international levels.

International Student Exchange Programmes

In an attempt to extend the curriculum and create Global citizens who would initiate change, the School has developed partnership with schools around the world. Our student exchange programme with Julius Echter Gymnasium Elsenfeld, Germany as well as St. Anna Gynasium in Munich, takes off on an exciting note during the summer with visits to Germany. Our tie up with Over Hall Community School, Cheshire, U.K will provide an opportunity for the students to learn about the cultures of other nations. The batch of students who are selected to visit schools around the world will be brand ambassadors of the country acquiring experiences and skills that matter today.

Scouts and Guides

The pupils are groomed to be responsible citizens and worthy leaders as envisioned by Lord Baden Powell by initiating them into the Scouts and Guides movement with the mission to contribute to the education of young people, through a value system based on the Scout Promise and Law to help build a better world where people not only have self-fulfillment as individuals but also play a constructive role in society.

Verdant Development Programme

To judiciously use existing resources and raise general awareness on the environment and its relevance to development, special projects are undertaken under the aegis of companies like Teri (The Energy Resources Institute), Eco Schools Programme etc, who are doing yeoman service in this direction. These programmes offer a unique hands-on- learning experience to the students making them the promoters of environmental education.

The facility of electronic communication has also enabled us to be environment friendly by reducing the usage of paper in the campus. All circulars, monthly newsletters and progress report cards are posted online for the benefit of students and teachers.

Knowledge Centre

To stimulate the reading habits in children, the library is well- stocked with an extensive collection of books, reference books, encyclopedias, dailies, magazines and journals. To encourage reading habits in children, an "Avid Reader Award" has been instituted.

Science Quest Zone

The school has state of the art laboratories to provide a perfect platform to quench the thirst for scientific knowledge. These labs provide ample scope for the students to experiment and boost their spirit of enquiry.

Mathe- Magic

Our modern and well-equipped Math Laboratory makes the learning of Math more interesting. It enables students to learn and explore mathematical concepts and verify mathematical facts and theorems using technology tools.

Tech Trek

In a world of inter connectivity, computers play an important role. The school has well - equipped computer labs for the use of students.

Technology Integration

At Delhi Public School, Bangalore East (Cambridge International), e-learning is accorded top priority. This helps students schooling with us to be better equipped to meet the challenges of modern day living. "Smart Class Boards" have been installed in every classroom. Provision of School Management System, a platform through the use of internet, enables parents to interact with the school and vice versa. Each child is provided with an Id and Password to allow them access to notices, alerts, date sheets and results online.

All circulars, class-wise monthly newsletters and report cards are posted online for the benefit of parents and students.

Security24/7

In order to ensure security coverage in & around our campus, Closed Circuit Cameras have been installed at vantage locations. This is in addition to the security provided by manned quards.

Cafeteria

With the objective of creating a home away from home, the school cafeteria with modern equipment caters to providing meals through the day. Every care is taken to maintain hygiene, cleanliness and provide nutritious and wholesome food.

Transport Service

We provide a fleet of well-maintained buses with trained drivers, conductors and helpers, equipped with CCTV cameras, First-aid kits and safety equipment. The personnel is regularly trained and guided to take care of the children using our school transport.

Counselling

The school has trained counsellors and special educators who provide counseling for behavioral and learning problems. The turbulent teens and situational mood swings are dealt with love, concern and most of all, quiet understanding. We also attempt at providing career guidance to the students.

Newspapers in Education

To endow the students with a cutting edge in assuming roles of well-informed individuals, the school has tied up with leading publishing houses who supply exclusive student edition of their newspaper. They not only inculcate the habit of reading but also enhance interaction with professionals from different fields.

Medicare Round the Clock

The school has qualified doctors and nurses to handle medical problems and take care of the students. Medical checkups are conducted twice a year. Frequently Asked QUESTIONS

What kind of students choose the IBCP?

The students choosing the IBCP tend be those who think long-term and want to keep their options open. It can lead to university or directly to a career, usually through higher level apprenticeship.

The programme prepares students for success in further study, but also develops the skills employers seek.

How does the IBCP give students advantages?

It enables them to gain qualifications recognised by universities and employers, not only throughout the UK but worldwide. IBCP students develop as highly effective teamworkers, showing self-confidence, determination, initiative and enterprise. The core of the programme also provides students with skill sets that they may not acquire through other qualifications

What makes the IBCP different?

The IBCP differs from most other post16 programmes because it unites both academic and vocational studies into a flexible and coherent course, rather than offering a 'pick and mix' selection of unconnected subjects.

It enables them to gain qualifications recognised by universities and employers, not only throughout the UK but worldwide. IBCP students develop as highly effective teamworkers, showing self-confidence, determination, initiative and enterprise. The core of the programme also provides students with skill sets that they may not acquire through other qualifications

Where is the IBCP available?

The IBCP is expanding very rapidly. At present, it is taught in 21 countries worldwide, with the largest numbers of IBCP schools found in the UK and the USA

How are the IB parts of the programme assessed?

05

Assessment is by a combination of examinations and coursework. The examinations are taken at the end of the programme, and marked externally by IB examiners. All IB subjects include coursework, which is assessed by the school

What are the core elements?

06

The Core is one of the most important differences between the IBCP and other post-16 qualifications and programmes. It is a compulsory element and consists of four components: Personal and Professional Skills, Service Learning, Language Development and a Reflective Project. These components are all blended together to develop critical thinking and intercultural understanding, and are at the heart of why IBCP students excel in job and university applications.

Why are IBCP students required to complete a Reflective Project?

The Reflective Project is an in-depth independent study, based on the vocational area chosen in the programme. It enables students to develop the research and writing skills that they will need to achieve at university, but will also use in their careers.

08 Why is there a Language Development component?

This part of the Core is designed to give students the confidence to work successfully in multicultural teams and international businesses. It is a culture based rather than vocabulary—based approach to exploring a new language, and has no examination.

What makes IBCP students special?


Because the IBCP develops students personally and socially, as well as academically, it raises their aspirations. It encourages students to be enterprising, a characteristic that it shares with all other IB programmes.

If a students has a specific career in mind, will choosing the IBCP impact on this?

At 16, some students already have a clear idea of their career intentions and are looking for hands-on experience in that field. The IBCP is ideal for students who are interested in a particular industry and want to specialise early on.
